

Parks Department Board Report August 11 (reporting on July)

Administrative Update

- Another successful Summer Camp has concluded this year. We sent out a survey to all camp staff and got some great positive feedback to improve next year's Summer Camp experience.
 We have created a survey to send out to the camper's parents. We are looking forward to hearing back from them to continue to improve the camp each year.
- This year the park will be providing a two week Winter Break Camp from 12/21-12/23 & 12/28 12/30 in the Aspen room of the Pavilion Center during the day 7:30 6p.m.
- The splash pad was down this month due to weather damage from a lightning storm. Lightning struck the activator on the Splash Pad which caused a short in the Mother Board. All parts have been ordered and the splash pad is back up and running again.
- The Maintenance staff has been busy this month repairing some of the damage that occurred from the flooding of July. Projects include fallen limbs on the trails, clearing debris, repairing erosion by the bridge and road on Whipple Lane and the splash pad.
- As the planning for our summer programs are coming to an end Marni is busy putting the
 finishing touches together on our upcoming fall programs. Programs to look forward to in
 August include Dog Days Family Camp Out in the Upper Park on 8/14 & Recreation Celebration
 on the Bike Trail here in the park on 8/29.
- I have been working this past month to create a Recreation Guide for the department. The Recreation Guide will include park general information, shelter reservation information, Pavilion Center information, upcoming programming and camp information. Recreation Guides will be printed by Hendricks Design and Printing and will be distributed all over town. Our hope is to have this be another way to raise awareness to the community and get participants into the park. Recreation Guides will be printed twice a year on a 6 month cycle.
