As the New Year begins, much of January was spent completing month and year end reports. Our personnel continue to work on programming and projects that were starting in 2015 to bring them to completion.

As you know, last month Chris Krahn and I traveled to Florida to look at a used Quint fire truck to function as a reserve apparatus for us. We were pleased with the truck that we looked at and are working to gather maintenance and testing records before we make final plans for the negotiations on the truck. Hopefully, these issues will be resolved and we will be able to close the deal and take delivery of the truck sometime next month.

As a change for this month's report, I thought that I would talk a little about a class that I took last week in Fishers.

One of the things that emergency response agencies attempt to do every day is to prepare in advance for a disaster. Disasters can be the result of many different situations, and can usually be classified as man-made or natural. Either way, many of the things that we do in any emergency situation are the same.

Historically, the fire service has been in the business of trying to design a control mechanism to help in the organization of disaster responses. This need has been an issue of importance to the fire service since the early 80's. When I first joined the fire service in the 80's, I was able to take advantage of a course taught by Chief Alan Brunacini, of the Phoenix Fire Department. He had developed a system of control called Incident Command where incidents were broken down into sections or divisions, to provide span of control and accountability. On the west coast, the National Forest Service had developed Fire Scope which was a principle that basically utilized that same try of program and layout. Their system was developed because of the large geographic areas encountered in wildland fires, as well as to better manage the many assets that they have battling those fires.

The course that I attended last week was an All Hazards Incident Management course. The All Hazards Management course is a platform developed by FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency), and is divided into many different levels of the Incident Command System ranging from the basic 100 course, to the most advanced program the 400 course. In

the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, it was realized that all responding agencies needed to have a common management system for large scale incidents that cover large areas with many different facets of response. This includes police, fire, hospital, public works and other local, county, state and federal responders. This management footprint is utilized on different levels from national responses to a local response that we might have in Washington Township.

The ICS (Incident Command System) is designed to provide support to responses in specific areas including Incident Command, Planning, Logistics, Finance, Safety, Operations, Public Information and Liaison. Each of these positions have a working function within an IMT (Incident Management Team).

IMT's are broken down into 5 Types and they are as follows:

Type 1 = Federal or State Asset

Type 2 = Federal or State (not as much training)

Type 3 = State or Metropolitan City

Type 4 = City, County or Municipal City

Type 5 = Local Tribe or Township

For that reason, if our township developed our own IMT it would be considered a Type 5.

In addition to the All Hazards class that I took last week, FEMA requires all IMT members to receive specific training in one of the disciplines mentioned above (Incident Command, Planning, etc.) to function within one of the positions. It is not specifically a requirement that you take the All Hazards class first and I took the Operations class in Ft. Wayne 4 years ago.

The State of Indiana has broken the state into 10 districts, and many of the districts also have IMT's that can function independently or in conjunction with a state IMT if it is activated. Activation of the IMT is at the discretion of the authority having jurisdiction, but often must be approved by the state or federal government if response reimbursement is going to be requested.

Currently, in the State of Indiana, there is a district IMT working at a large bird flu outbreak in southern Indiana. Since the outbreak, two different IMT's have functioned on the scene and others may be required before the end of the response. During the snows last week on the eastern seaboard, the City Of Boston requested the District 5 (which Hendricks County is a part of) IMT to respond to assist with the snow emergency. Usually, team deployments are only intended to last 7-10 days, before a new IMT is rotated in. So in a local, state or federal level, our district could, and has been requested to respond to assist. Participation in responses is

strictly voluntary depending on availability, and funding reimbursement is usually situation dependent.

Chief George is trained as an Incident Commander at the federal level and has responded to several incidents as a federal IMT member as well as a responder on Indiana Task Force One. This week he traveled to Denver for a meeting and training for the federal FEMA response IMT.

So in closing, and reflecting back to what I just mentioned about Chief George and his involvement in both the federal IMT and Task Force, I would like to recognize him. His service and training is an asset to us both federally, on a state level and locally as well.
