In previous Chief's Reports I have told you about the two members that we have recently lost. One left us to take a job at Wayne Township and the second left to take a job at Danville. We replaced the first vacancy with the first member from the county hiring process. He began a recruit class at Wayne Township in April and will be completed in August. The second vacancy we attempted to hire a medic from the county hiring process, and that individual turned the offer down. We then went to the second person on the county hiring process. After putting that individual through pre-employment physicals, he began the recruit class at Wayne Township also. After three days in recruit class, he advised his team leader that "this was not for him" and he did not return to class on the fourth day. Since that time, he has tendered his resignation and turned in his equipment. We are currently exploring the possibility of hiring another paramedic from the list. This individual is not a firefighter, so we have contacted Indianapolis Fire to see if we can have this person attend their recruit class that is currently in progress. At this time, they are conducting EMT classes, which this person

does not need. The fire portion of the school start in mid-July if we can get him in the class. If that direction does not work, we will return to the list and look for other solutions. We do have a backup plan in place in that event.

Last Saturday, two members of our department, Chief Adams and Firefighter/Paramedic Kelly Mikesell, departed for Colorado to attend a hazardous materials training course presented by CSX. This is a very intense class and is difficult to get personnel into. The personnel at our local CSX rail yard were instrumental in helping us to obtain these spots for our personnel. We look forward to the knowledge that will be shared upon their return and also hope to have the opportunity in the future to send other members of the department to this valuable training. Last week, Chief Adams also ordered our new entry suits that we are purchasing with grant funds from the Indiana Department of Emergency Management. We hope to have those suits in the next week or so and will conduct training on the new suits after their arrival.

Today I met our engineer from Triad Engineering at Station 143 to look at the HVAC work that has been completed to this point, and also to meet with contractors who will perform drywall and paint work. During the meeting, Triad found several things that were suppose to have been done by the HVAC contractor, that were not done or not done properly. He will be contacting that contractor this week and advising me when the work will be corrected and completed. The drywall and paint work is being bid at this time and will hopefully be completed by late July or early August.

With the end of school upon us, Karen and many of our staff and department members have conducted several visits to school. Karen is now preparing for summer camp and she will be conducting her first presentation to the campers next week. This afternoon, Karen made her first Project Lifesaver run to Plainfield. An elderly gentleman had wandered away from his wife at the Kroger store and she could not find him. Several department including Plainfield, Avon, Danville and Brownsburg responded and began to process of searching for the man. Thankfully, the gentleman was quickly found at home where someone had picked him up from where he had wandered and took him home. The run was a good opportunity for all the department to work together to conduct an organized search and exercise their equipment. Evidently, the gentleman who we were looking for had just stopped at Plainfield Fire and had his battery changed. This to was timely in that we knew that he had a fresh battery and his frequency had been checked. Thanks to Plainfield for keeping up on their duties with their clients and great work by Karen in keeping the supplies up to date. This is a great service that we are fortunate to have the personnel to commit to this worthwhile program.

I hope that each of you had an opportunity to see the Flyer last week. We were featured in two front page articles. The first one featured Firefighter/Paramedic Ted Allen and I in relation to a promotional program that we did with Hendricks Regional Health. The hospital recently opened a cardiac cath lab and the program centered around that program. Our Avon School superintendent was our patient and the program centered around a patient who was at the YMCA doing exercise when she experienced chest pain, and was subsequently transported by us from the Y to HRH where she was stabilized and later flown to a cardiac care center in Indy. It was a great opportunity for us to partner with the hospital we are affiliated with and help promote a great community supporter. The second article showcased the current fitness initiative that we are partnering with the park to present. It highlighted Karen and the fitness classes that she is presenting at the

park on Tuesday evenings. Prior to that article, Karen had told me that the attendance had been dropping since summer was coming on and we were evaluating the need to adjust the program. After the article last weekend, Karen told me that she had 26 people at last Tuesday nights offering. Several of the attendants told her that they did not know about the programs and plan to return. We are excited about future possibilities.

As I close out this month's report, I have included a note from an individual who we assisted at one of the cemeteries. Thanks to Chief Jim Adams, Chief Gerald George, Lt. Brent Shepherd, David Bandy and James Smith for their great customer service!

I had a problem and the Avon F.D came to my rescue!!!!

I'd like to send a BIG "Thank you" to Chief George, Lt. Brent Shepherd and the entire crew of Ladder Truck # 141.

For many years I have maintained the flag pole and flags at the Veterans Memorial located inside the Shiloh Cemetery located at 571 N. C R 1050 E. here in Avon, IN. On Tuesday, May 20th I went to the cemetery to install new flags just before Memorial Day. The rope on the flag pole had deteriorated and failed. I was at a loss as how to replace the rope. A friend of mine who is a retired IFD gave me a name, (Jim Adams) of Avon FD so I called Jim and he had me contact Chief George who told me they could help me with my problem. On June 2nd. Lt. Brent Shepherd gave me a call, and we met at the cemetery and made the needed repairs.

I took several pictures and tried to send them to Lt. Shepherd, but the e-mail address he gave me would not work. So I am going to attach those pictures to this posting just for you guys!!!

The Shiloh Cemetery was founded in 1823 and has veterans buried their dating back to the Revolutionary War. Thanks to the Avon F.D. our flags are flying high once again!!!!
