The past month has been very busy in many different aspects. As I mentioned at last month's meeting, National Fire Prevention Week was upon us, and we had many different activities during the month to promote and celebrate the event. On top on the many different tours and visits that we facilitated, we also conducted an Open House on the Saturday of fire prevention week. Chick-Fil-A was gracious in providing us with sandwiches, The Pickett Group, a local Remax agent, provided drinks and chips for the event as well as personnel to help with refreshments. I think that we estimated that we had somewhere around 400 people visit the three stations during the event. On Wednesday of the week, we also did a free pizza delivery with in partnership with the local Domino's Pizza. Domino's provided free pizza to anyone that ordered pizza from 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. if they had working smoke detectors in their home. Chief George, Chief Carpenter, Karen Hendershot, Bob Reffett and I accompanied drivers who delivered the pizzas, and we checked the detectors. I think that we were able to award

pizza to around 8 families, while at the same time, providing information to increase safety to our residents. Thanks to Karen for all her hard work that week and thanks to all of the other department members who assisted in making the week a great success.

Our Engine team has been spending the month looking at the bids that were presented and looking at trucks that are they type specified by the bidders. Hopefully, with Chief George's assistance, we will get a final selection made by the end of next week. Sometime after the first of the year, we will be working on the financing piece of the process and obtaining bids for the engine and ambulance financing.

The mold repair work that we have been completing at Station 143 is not complete. Both contractors have finished the work that they began, and we have received final completion documents from the engineer for payment. Those payments have been processed, and I believe that we came in under budget for the work. We are still waiting for final billing from the engineering company, and then the project should be complete. We are currently looking at flooring solutions for Station 143, because we have a large number of tiles that are coming up there. We will make this flooring project a priority for the balance of this year. We are also looking at work that we may do on the flooring at both of our other stations. If we do not have the funding to complete the work this year, we will schedule it for the first of 2015.

For the past couple of months, we have been looking at possibly converting our lift station at Station 141 to a gravity system. To do this, we needed to solicit permission from the church that owns the home behind the station to run our pipe through their property. I also needed to receive bids for contractors for the project. To date, I have received permission from the church to cross their property in consideration for some work that may need completed to the home so that they can hook it to the sewer at the same time that we do our work. In addition, I am still waiting for quotes to return from three excavators for the construction portion. Our hope is that we can complete the project before the weather gets to bad this fall. We currently have a temporary wire running to the pit that we hope to have removed before snow plowing in necessary.

Last week, the Civilian Fire Safety board met and acted on two issues. First, they approved the Lieutenant's promotion list from the process that we just completed. With that being said, Jerry Bessler was the number one person on the list and will be assuming his new Lieutenant's position on B Shift at Station 143 on November 9. In addition, the board also voted to expire our current hiring list. The list that we created earlier this year has exhausted the top 20 candidates, as well as some paramedics that did not score in the top 20. Some of the lower candidates on the list that were offered positions were not able to pass the per-employment testing, so it was decided that it would be best to conduct a new process. I have been working with the other county fire chief's to begin the process of scheduling the components of the process. It will most likely not be completed until the beginning of 2015. We currently have one open position that we will plan to fill with a candidate from the next process.

On Saturday of this week, our department will be resurrecting our Scouting Explorer program. Two of our firefighters, Bob Reffett and Doug Phillips have agreed to be the leaders of the program, and we are excited that we have individuals that are interested in our local youth, and are willing to give of their free time to begin the program again. Bob, Doug and Karen have been working hard to publicize the event and we are expecting a great turnout. Dan Mechuta, the gentleman that oversaw our program previously will also be a part of the leadership. We are excited about the possibilities for your youth in the future. Thanks Bob and Doug for all of your preparation and hard work.

As I close this month's Chief's Report, it is extremely difficulty to make a selection for me to highlight for outstanding work in October. Karen's hard work with fire prevention week and Bob's work with the Explorers definitely meet the criteria for being recognized. But I feel that I would be remiss if I did not specifically mention all of the

long hours and hard work that Chief Allen has put in the past two or three weeks. Ted took it upon himself to gather response agencies within the county to begin work and discussions about how we as a county should respond to Ebola patients. There have been many meetings over the past few weeks and Ted has worked hard to prepare training and equipment for the protection of not only our personnel, but for other agencies also. Ted has worked many long hours and extra days completing work on these issues, and the culmination of his efforts has been a response plan has been accepted by all department in the county. We are also receiving calls from outside the county asking for information about his efforts and work. Many of our staff personnel have assisted Ted in completing the work that had to be done, but Ted has been our ahead and leading us all. No amount of gratitude can express the pride that we should have for Ted's work. Ted, a simple thanks does not seem enough, but thanks!






