This month, the board should have received some updated information about the CUM fund. This included an updated needs list that was provided to Jeff Peters for sustainability planning as well as a lease spreadsheet. About a month ago, Pat Laughlin asked me to create this spreadsheet to show current and future lease payments. Hopefully, this sheet is correct with a few minor adjustments that may have to be made. As I stated, it is easy to project lease costs for leases that are already executed, but variations in down payments and project final costs could also change these calculations. Also, we do our best to try to plan for things on the horizon that may need repaired, but cannot always to this. One example of this would be the fact that our fire alarm system at Station 141 is currently malfunctioning, and there is possibility that we may need to replace the entire system including control box and heads. This is obviously something that cannot be planed for.

For the majority of my report, I would like to give you some information about an employee wellness program that I am attempting to develop for our department.

Over the past few years, our department has experienced some incidents within our ranks that, at the time did not seem to be a specific pattern. But looking back on those incidents as well as some that we are currently dealing with, there are several situations where an opportunity was presented where we could have responded in a different way to meet the needs of our personnel. By no means were we negligent in what we have provided our personnel in the past, but they were opportunities.

Over the past several years, the fire service has become more concerned about firefighter/EMS mental health, and the cumulative effects of the repeated stressors that many experience in our profession. These job stressors, along with compounded stresses of everyday life has manifested itself in negative ways for may fire service personnel. With my report, I have included an article from last week that talks about a female firefighter from Virginia, and the many personnel and professional stresses that escalated to the point that she took her own life. In addition, two weeks ago, I attended several course during FDIC that dealt with firefighter mental health. The following were some of the statistics that were presented:

- 1. Suicide is the #1 cause of death in America, even higher than homicides. The fire service experienced 112 suicides last year, this is only those that were reported or recognized. So suicide takes more lives in the fire service than line of duty deaths.
- 2. 85% of all married firefighters will end up in divorce.
- 3. 67% of all people deal with some kind of depression.

These statistics drive home the need for a total wellness program for our personnel. We require annual physicals for personnel to address any physical problems that they may be facing, but we do not do psychological wellness checks except when an employee is hired, or when there is a problem. Our hope is that we can develop a program that will provide preventative wellness that will address which we hope will provide dividends in the long run by impacting not only the needs of our personnel before they become a problem. Hopefully this will equate to more healthy employees both physically, but mentally which will in turn decrease employee absenteeism, medical claims and discipline problems.

Approximately 2 months ago, I had lunch with Chief Dave Haboush, the chief of the Carmel Fire Department as well as a member of his department who is a peer wellness counselor. All of the fire departments in Hamilton County participate in a peer wellness program, and Chief Haboush was

kind enough to allow me to copy the resource materials that they have for their personnel. He also informed me of how the program works in their county. The program was developed by Dr. Robert Smith. Dr. Smith is a retired Indianapolis firefighter, who is also a clinician and who we have also referred some of our personnel to. Two weeks ago, I had a meeting with Dr. Smith and we talked about his development of the program and how it might be useful in our county. He advised at the time that he is interested in helping us develop a program.

After my meeting with Dr. Smith, I realized that there were also a couple of components that I felt were missing from their program that I would like to incorporate into our program. One component is that I would like to develop a fire department chaplain program for our department. We currently have one firefighter, Lieutenant Jerry Bessler, who has had training in fire department chaplaincy, and Jerry has an interest in helping us to develop this component. I would also like to develop a financial component to the program where we can assist personnel in seeking financial counseling when they are facing serious financial situations such as bankruptcy, severe debt stresses or the foreclosure of a home. I would also like to try to develop some relationships with legal counselors that can give legal advice in a time of need.

During my time in working on the components of the program, it became apparent that this program was something that could potentially be of an advantage to the entire county, including volunteer departments. With that in mind, I have been meeting with both career and volunteer chiefs in the county to gauge the desire to be a part of the program. In speaking with those chiefs, I am also seeking support for the county fire chiefs to write grants on the behalf of the association to try to seek support for the program so that the expense would not have to be shouldered by any one department. So far, I have received favorable response from the chiefs.

With all of this in mind, it is my expectation that there will be some initial investment in the development and startup of the program, and we will be seeking some of that funding in our May meeting. In addition, I would expect for there to be some yearly budgetary need for each department, depending on their specific department needs. I have also approached our Avon union president so gauge the interest in the participation of the union in this project. I believe that as we move forward and have some concrete financial projections, the union will choose to assist with the effort also.

In an effort to keep my report short, I will stop at this point and hope that this information has given you some information about our plans for the program. As always, I would be happy to answer any specific questions that you might have before or during our monthly meeting.



Jeff comes from a family of fire service personnel, including his dad, Ron, who functioned as a career firefighter for Washington Township Fire Department in Marion County, and also volunteered for our department and served for many years and his service included serving as Chief of the department. Jeff's brother, Josh, also served our department as a firefighter until he left our service for a Jeffersonville, Indiana fire department. We would like to congratulate Jeff on his mile stone of 20 years and thank him for his dedication and service. Thanks Jeff!

Missing Virginia Firefighter's Death Ruled a Suicide

FAIRFAX STATION, Va. (ABC7) — The Medical Examiner announced Friday that Nicole Mittendorff, the missing Fairfax County firefighter, died by suicide-hanging.

This news comes on the heels of concerns that she was a victim of bullying. On Saturday, Fire Chief Richard Bowers issued a statement regarding Nicole Mittendorff:

"I would like to take a minute to address the local web forum posts that so many of you have been discussing regarding Firefighter-Nicole Mittendorff. We at Fairfax Fire and Rescue are aware of the posts and are looking into the matter. I assure you that my department cannot and will not tolerate bullying of any kind. At this time, we are respecting the privacy of Firefighter-Paramedic Mittendorff's family, and providing support to the men and women of the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department who are grieving under these challenging circumstances. We will thoroughly investigate this matter and take any appropriate actions needed. However, right now we ask that we be allowed to grieve the loss of one of our own."

Police found a suicide note in Mittendorff's car Thursday afternoon after discovering her body. The details of that suicide note remain unknown.

In the past several hours however, we have become aware of online message boards in which Mittendorff's name has been used in an extremely negative manner.

Some of the posts purported to have been written by members of the Fairfax County Fire Department, where she worked for three years.

We have been told the department is aware of this online activity, but today they focused solely on coping with this very recent tragedy.

Jeff Dill, the founder of the Firefighters Behavior Health Alliance, says many in the field suffer from strained marital and family relationships, and addition, but do not open up about serious problems.

Dill tracks firefighter and EMT suicides nationwide.

"It's something that's missing in the fire and EMS world. We don't talk about those things in fire academies and our officer classes," Dill says. "So if we can just keep on bringing the educational awareness that it's okay to ask for help."
