The month of August seemed to be the month of symposiums for the WTAFD staff. Last month, 6 individuals from the department attended the International Association of Arson Investigators conference in Plainfield. This conference was a gathering of fire investigators from many different disciplines who conduct fire investigations in the public and private sector. Topics covered included automobile arson fires, accelerant detections dogs and digital documentation of fire scenes just to mention a few. This conference also provides in service hours for our investigators.

The second conference that was attended last month was the Indiana Emergency Response Conference which as previously the Indiana State Fire Chief's Conference. We had 6 personnel that attended that conference which is tailored specifically to emergency response personnel including police, fire, EMS and emergency management personnel. Again this year, I had the privilege of teaching two different classes at the conference. One was entitled "The Other 80%" and in that class I talked about fire officer development and initiatives that we had in place to increase our officers knowledge base. The other class was titled "Stop, Drop and Roll" where I talked about the history of public education, past fire department educational topics and practices and I presented ideas for ways that departments could further their reach with topics that specifically impact issues within their jurisdiction. At that conference, three of our personnel, Battalion Chief Jason Porter, Division Chief Ted Allen and Public Educator Karen Hendershot were nominated for awards including Instructor of the Year, EMS Officer of the Year and Public Educator of the year. Unfortunately, none of them were successful in their nominations, but two of them came in second.

The third conference that was attended last month was the International Association of Fire Chiefs Conference in Atlanta, Georgia. Chief George attended that conference along with fire officers from around the globe, and Chief George advised me that he got many good ideas and attended many good trainings. He advised that he especially gleaned some good information on officer development that he hopes to share in future officer training within the department.

On Wednesday morning after our board meeting, I will be departing early in the morning for the National Fire Academy. I will be attending the Executive Fire Officer Symposium that runs from September 10-12. This year I have the privilege of being on the program planning committee and will assist with the presenters in the program. This year I was tasked with organizing the "Chuck Chat" presenters for the program. Chuck Chats are short informational sessions within the conference that last 20-30 minutes and provide individuals to talk about timely topics that affect the fire service and how they are capitalizing on them in their organizations. It is patterned after the Ted Talks that are popular in the business industry. Two specific topics that will be covered at the conference during general sessions include "Data, Data, Data" which will talk about how fire departments can capitalize on statistical data to drive decisions. A second general session presentation is being presented by a lawyer, who will talk about the Station Club Fire which was a large loss fire that occurred in a night club several years ago. He will talk about specific portions of the litigation of survivors involved in the fire and how the loss of life at that fire impacted our current life safety fire codes. I recently ready this gentleman's book entitled "Killer Show" by John Barylick, where he talks about the fire and its impact on many people's lives. It was interesting reading.

This month, we have two individuals who will be attending training in Lafayette. FF/Paramedic Kelly Mikesell will be attending a 12 lead heart monitor training and FF Joe Valorani will be attending a two day hazardous materials class in Lafayette.

This month, Karen Hendershot will be attending the national Project Lifesaver conference in Colorado. Last year when Karen attended the conference for the first time, she entered and won the tracking competition, so we are hoping for a repeat performance again this year. On the topic

of Project Lifesaver and autism, last week our personnel attended training about autism that was presented by a firefighter for West Lafayette that has a son with autism. This gentleman travels around the state talking to emergency response issues relating to autism. He brought a great perspective to our personnel especially due to the fact that he was speaking from personal experience.

So much for training. On to our Explorer Post news. Our post will be hosting an open house for perspective new personnel on Saturday, September 12. The post has become very active and FF Bob Reffett and FF Doug Phillips have done a great job of organizing and presenting this program to our Explorers. They have also received a great deal of help from Chief Porter and Chief Adams.

Our new engine is scheduled to be on the road by the end of this week or beginning of next week. All of the new equipment has come in and been mounted by Chief Adams and Chris Krahn, and the other items from the current engine will be moved in the next couple of days. We have also had some issues corrected that needed to be fixed by the manufacturer before we placed it in service.

As I stated in previous reports, Chief George, Bob Wellington and I have been working with Pike Township Fire Department to come up with a maintenance agreement so that we can have Pike perform our equipment maintenance. That contract was finalized last week and we look forward to starting with Pike in the next two weeks.

Our flooring work at the stations is coming along nicely. Station 141 is completed with the exception of a couple of touch ups, and Station 142 should be completed by midweek next week. We are awaiting bids back from flooring contractors to complete the tile work that we need to complete at Station 142 and 143, and hope to have that work completed by the end of this month.

We are still waiting on feedback from Triad Engineering to decide on a course of action for the mold issue that we continue to address at Station 143. We did receive written confirmation from a testing company that we do not have any health concerns that would necessitate moving personnel out of the station. The mold issue that we are encountering in the back building at headquarters is being addressed by an outside contractor at no charge to the township and should be completed in the next two weeks.

Chief George and I continue to attend construction meetings on the Ronald Regan project. We were required to replace a culvert pipe on the west side of the station, which has required our personnel to respond out of the east side of the station. This situation will most likely remain until mid-September, when the contractors will have the drive replace at least in gravel until the concrete is poured. There is a deadline of September 17 to have the new portions of the road ready to open, at which time they will move traffic to the new side and begin work on the west side. While doing the work on the west side of the road, the contractors will be installing the warning lights in front of the entrance to the apron at the station. I believe that the project from US 36 to 100 north is scheduled to be completed by the end of October. This month, Don, Pat and I met with INDOT as well as Greg Steurwald and Pete Miller to discuss the potential of having the warning light installed in front of Station 141. At the time, INDOT stated that under current requirements, our specific situation may not provide circumstances that would allow the installation of the light. After our meeting, the INDOT representatives were going to do research to get specific answers. During our conversations, it was discussed that a legislative fix might be a way to address the problem, and Rep. Steurwald stated that he would gladly carry legislation that would address that fix. We are still awaiting feedback from INDOT.

Those are just a few of the issue of interest for the board. In closing, I would like to recognize FF Chris Krahn, Lt. Jon Josephs and Lt. Brent Shepherd for their willingness to attend the arson conference last month. Both of our Lieutenants are currently investigators on the department and FF Krahn is just beginning his training to be a part of the investigation team. Even though these individuals attending a portion of the trainings during shift time, they also attended portions of the conference off duty without pay. This attendance speaks to their dedication to our department and to the desire that they have to continue their training and education. Thanks gentlemen!
